

## **ATHLETIC SPECIAL ASSIGNMENTS**

## **EXHIBIT "C"**

Special assignments are defined as services which are necessary and desirable in the function of the schools, and which require time and assumption of responsibilities by members of the bargaining unit beyond their normal duties.

It shall be policy to consider both normal duties and special assignments of the school as part of the teaching load of the school. The immediate supervisor, under the supervision of the Superintendent or his/her designees, shall endeavor to effect equitable distribution of the workload among members of the unit. In instances where it is impractical or impossible to make an adjustment in the normal duties, extra compensation shall be paid. The following constitutes the total list of approved Athletic Special Assignments. Actual decisions regarding the number of Special Assignments should be in accordance with Administrative Regulation 4127.1, Staffing Guidelines for Athletic Special Assignments.

Athletic Coaches must provide written proof of expertise in the following areas:

- Theory and techniques
- Rules and regulations in the athletic activity being coached
- Child or adolescent psychology as it relates to sports participation.

Athletic Coaches are required to maintain current First Aid and CPR certifications.

### **SPECIAL ASSIGNMENT EXPERIENCE FACTOR SCHEDULE**

The actual compensation paid for a given special assignment shall be determined by multiplying the base compensation times the appropriate experience factor obtained below.

- If a coach leaves a position in a sport for another position in the same sport, his/her experience factor continues because the sport is the same.
- If a coach leaves a sport for another sport, he/she will start the new sport at experience level 1.
- If a coach adds another sport, he/she will start the new sport at experience level 1.
- If a coach leaves a sport, then comes back to it, he/she will pick up the experience level where he/she left off.

The following special assignments shall be expressed in terms of a special assignments percentage multiplier applied to the sum of \$19,618 effective July 1, 2007.
