

**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (#14) BETWEEN
PETALUMA CITY (ELEMENTARY) AND JOINT UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICTS
AND
PETALUMA FEDERATION OF TEACHERS**

The Petaluma City Schools District ("District") and The Petaluma Federation of Teachers ("PFT") agree to the following one-year Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") related to **Special Education Staffing** effective July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023.


Due to the difficulties in hiring some certificated special education positions this year, the Parties agree to the following regarding offering an additional .2 FTE assignments (overages) to full time special education teachers choosing to accept the offer for the Fall Semester. The parties will review the assignments at the end of November before agreeing to continue the assignments into the Spring Semester by mutual consent.

For teachers who accept an additional .2 FTE temporary assignment to bring their employment to 1.2 FTE, one of the following situations will apply:


- Increased caseload for RSP from 28 up to 33 students.
- Teach five sections (for Secondary Teachers).
- or -
- Act as a Mentor for a special education intern (PIP) and provide additional assessments/testing and IEP support for the intern's caseload.

This MOU is non-precedent setting and shall sunset June 30, 2023 unless the parties mutually agree to extend in writing.


