

**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (#19) BETWEEN
PETALUMA CITY (ELEMENTARY) AND JOINT UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICTS
AND
PETALUMA FEDERATION OF TEACHERS**


The Petaluma City Schools District ("District") and The Petaluma Federation of Teachers ("PFT"), hereinafter referred to as "the parties," agree to the following Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") regarding overages to class size for Physical Education Classes at Petaluma Junior High School.

MOU #9 signed on February 24, 2022 outlines class limits for Physical Education class load at the junior high shall be a maximum of 175 student contacts per day at the junior high school with no more than two sections larger than 36 with a maximum of 37 students per section. One PE teacher (Amy Silveira-McGaughey) has a class load of 181 students, which is over the contractual maximum of 175 student contacts. To compensate her for the additional work associated with this class load, Amy will receive \$9,000 dispersed in two payments of \$4,500 each in December and May.

The District appreciates Amy's flexibility in serving the students of Petaluma Junior High School.

This MOU is non-precedent setting and shall sunset June 30, 2023 unless the parties mutually agree to extend in writing.


